V. INVITATIONS

A) CSI-W

a) Classes 01-04 and 8-10:

- all riders acc. to b) qualified for the World Cup Tour.
- up to 4 further foreign riders are admitted. Foreign riders will be invited through their respective home NF.
- Further German riders:
 - up to 4 German riders who will be nominated by the federal trainer jumping.
 - up to 4 German riders who on invitation of the organizer will be nominated by the federal trainer jumping.

b) Classes 05 to 07 – World Cup Tour (FEI Art. 654 – qualifications)

1.1 The Top Ten of the FEI World Ranking List. If a rider from the Top Ten decides not to compete at an event, he may be replaced by a rider nominated by the NF of the rider. Such replacement must be from the Top 45 of the Computer List. If the NF cannot replace the rider in question, he/she may be replaced by the organisers from the top 45 on the Computer List from a foreign country or from the home country from the top 100 on the Computer List. These riders are pre-qualified for the World Cup competition. 10

Unused starting places in paragraph 1.1 go to paragraph 1.5 if the total number is 40 or less and to paragraph 2 if there are more than 40.

- 1.2 Each NF of a country organising a World Cup Competition in Western Europe may send one rider to each World Cup event in Western Europe.
Unused starting places in paragraph 1.2 go to paragraph 1.5 if the total number is 40 or less and to paragraph 2 if there are more than 40. These riders are pre-qualified for the World Cup competition. max. 11
A substitution following receipt of definite entries is not pre-qualified for the World Cup competition.
- 1.3 Western European countries with at least 3.5 Million inhabitants, but not organising a World Cup Competition in Western Europe, may send one rider to each World Cup event, provided that at least one rider from the country is in the Top 60 of the Computer List, or 2 in the Top 200. These riders are pre-qualified for the World Cup competition. 03
Unused starting places from this category go to the starting places allocated by the host NF.
- 1.4 The three NF's with the most points obtained by having riders placed 11 to 60 in the Computer List may send a second rider to each event in Western Europe. The following scale of points applies:
a rider placed 11 to 25 = 2 points
a rider placed 26 to 60 = 1 point
In case of a tie the higher individual placing of the country's riders in the Computer List divides. 03
The above only applies to the NFs with six or less riders eligible to participate in accordance with paragraph 1.1 and 1.2. The above does not apply to the home country.
Unused starting places in paragraph 1.4 go to paragraph 1.5 if the total number is 40 or less and to paragraph 2 if there are more than 40.
These riders are pre-qualified for the World Cup competition. A substitution following receipt of definite entries is not pre-qualified for the World Cup competition.
- 1.5 Five additional riders from the home NF are invited to the home event, nominated by the NF. 05
These riders are pre-qualified for the world cup competition.
The DOKR gives accordingly starting permits (incl. possible starting places from Western European Countries (see above)
- Total max. 32
2. The Organising Committee has 7 or 8 Wild Cards to invite additional riders. They only have the automatic right to compete in the World Cup Competition if there are 40 or less riders at the event. Since more than 40 competitors will be invited there will be two qualifying competitions for the 7 or 8 remaining starting places.
- Max. four horses per rider are allowed; three horses for the CSI classes and one horse for the youngster tour. Each horse may be started twice per day.
- c) in addition for classes 02, 04:
- Riders who are placed 1st – 3rd in class 25 (national class) (Para IX.3.a and b. have to be adhered to!).
 - If any of these riders have already received an invitation acc. to V.A.a), the next rider acc. to the placement in class 25 will be qualified.
 - Moving up due to a qualified rider having withdrawn is only possible in agreement with the OC.

One horse per rider.

The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting competitors („masterlist“), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.

B) CAI-W

Open to 5 drivers of the Top Ten Drivers 2006, 1 driver from overseas as well as one driver from the home nation with wild card jointly allocated acc. to WC rules driving by the German NF and the organizer. A further wild card may be allocated to 1 home driver, jointly selected by the NF and the respective OC. Each driver may enter 5 horses.

C) Admitted Competitors CSI Amateurs (comp. 13-21)

Foreign Competitors:

Competitors who have an Amateur Owner licence of their respective NF will be invited by the organizer through their home NF.

Number of foreign competitors: approx. 20 from about 5 nations

German Competitors:

Approx. 30 German competitors who have an Amateur Owner licence of the NF GER and who will be invited by the organizer

All Competitors:

- Number of horses per rider: 3
- Admitted are only non-professional riders who make not a living (neither fully nor partly) from riding, dealing, training of horses and/or riders with own horses or horses belonging to other family members. The buying and selling of horses as well as receiving prize money in cash are not forbidden, providing they so not constitute the competitor's only source of income. Holding the "Amateur Owner" status, does not bar competitors from taking part in other competitions or Championships. As long as the competitor holds the "Amateur Owner" status, he/she will not be allowed to take part in international or national initial competitions with an height of 1.50 m or greater.
- Amateur Owner riders need a "Amateur licence" of their respective NF.
- The Amateur Owner licence will be issued by the riders respective NF and has to be applied for by the rider in due time before begin of the event.

VI. Facilities Offered

1. Competitors CSI-W/CSI Amateurs

CSI competitors get special conditions at the Leipzig Marriott Hotel and Westin Hotel. Special conditions for all competitors may only be granted if the reservation is sent with the entries to En Garde.

Accommodation for the 40 competitors of the World Cup competition (comp. 7) is at the cost of the organizer from 17th to 21st January, 2007; or if requested with the nominated entries until 22nd January, 2007 (morning).

Meals: VIP area (hall 1) and grooms' catering.

2. Grooms CSI-W/CSI Amateurs

One groom per rider.

Meals: Breakfast and dinner in hall 5 near the stables; lunch at the casino in the administration building.

Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms with hot and cold water will be provided by the OC.

3. Stable Area / CSI-W / CSI Amateurs

Size of boxes according to FEI rules.

Stabling will be free of charge; for **additional** horses a fee of 140 € per horse (incl. VAT) will be levied, first bedding included.

Forage, hay, straw and shavings can be purchased with the stable manager.

Prices incl. VAT: straw 3,50 €, hay 7 €, shavings 14 €.

4. Competitors/Grooms CAI-W

Drivers receive free accommodation for themselves and two grooms for four overnight stays

Name and sex of the grooms have to be given with the entries.

Meals: Breakfast and dinner in hall 5 near the stables; lunch in the casino in the administration building.

Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms with hot and cold water will be provided by the OC.

5. Stable Area / CAI-W

Stabling for CAI horses (including 1st bedding) will be free of charge. Forage, hay, straw and shavings can be purchased with the stable manager.

Prices incl. VAT: straw 3,50 €, hay 7 €, shavings 14 €.

Each driver will receive transport expenses at the rate of € 2.- per km one way (maximum € 2,000.-)

6. Transporters and Live-in-Caravans

The license plate and the size of transporters/live-in-caravans has to be given with the entries.

Electric supply for CSI/CAI competitors will be charged with 60 € incl. VAT. Electricity has to be ordered together with the entry.

7. Arrival / Departure

The OC facilitates competitors and grooms on their arrival and on their departure. Therefore the OC needs date, time and means of transport of arrival and departure of competitors and horses.

The stables will be available as of Wednesday, 17th January 2007, 10.00 a.m. and have to be cleared by Monday, 22nd January 2007, 08.00 a.m.

8. Shuttle Service

A Shuttle-Service from the show ground to the hotel will be arranged.

9. ADVERTISING AND PUBLICITY ON COMPETITORS AND HORSES (Art. 136.1-2)

- IMPORTANT - Entry forms must include the following information on horses/ponies:
name of horse/pony, date of birth, breed, country of birth, stud-book initials, passport number, colour, sex, name(s) of owner(s)
Entries without this information will not be accepted.
- The entries have to be made through the HippoBase online entry system. Discipline responsables of National Federations who do not yet have a user account are requested to send their full name, email and phone to support@hippobase.com.
- German competitors have to use the riders' entry cheques with the valid horse stickers.
- Closing dates of entries have to be adhered to. Later changes will only be accepted on approval of the OC.
- The number and kind of required stables, the number of required electric supplies and the required accommodation (kind, arrival and departure date) have to be given with the entries.
- If the entry does not contain information on hotel, number of boxes and/or electric supply, the OC reserves, one electric supply and per horse entered one box. All expenses will be charged to the rider's account. Hotel rooms are only booked when ordered.

The following fees are payable with the entry:

CSI

Entry fee per competitor/per horse: 350,00 EUR; Youngster: 250,00 EUR; riders who have qualified from the national competition 25: 275,00 EUR, included VAT; this amount includes: entry fee, MCP-fee, LK fee.

Further fees will be charged with the final invoice: forage, bedding, electricity.

CSI-Amateurs

Entry fee: per competitor/per horse 1.000 € plus VAT; this amount includes entry fee, LK-fee per reserved starting place, MCP fee per horse, stabling fee, 1 VIP card for the weekend of the event. The entry fee has to be handed in together with the entry.

Further fees will be charged with the final invoice: forage, bedding, electricity.

CAI-W

Entry fee per four-in-hand: 500,00 EUR, included VAT; this amount includes: entry fee, MCP-fee, LK fee as well as stabling fee.

Further fees will be charged with the final invoice: forage, bedding, electricity.

If any rider withdraws after the date of definite entries without a valid excuse (example: illness or lameness - medical certificate has to be presented), the competitor or his/her home NF will be held liable to reimburse the OC for the actual financial loss suffered by the OC (i.e. limited to stabling and hotel expenses) as a result of the late withdrawal.

VIII. CUSTOMS FORMALITIES/HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

1. Customs Formalities

According Vet. Reg. Art. 1004.2 the relevant National Veterinarian Authorities have to be informed four weeks in advance to assure a smooth frontier crossing of the horses from abroad.

For questions pertaining to the veterinary and animal diseases legislation for horses from abroad and regarding the horses' transportation, the following transport agency is ready to assist:

Custom and veterinary fees will not be taken over. A fee of 30 EUR per horse is charged for customs formalities

2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

Every competitor is supplied to deliver all necessary certificates of health for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Regulations 90/426 of the actual valid form (sample is enclosed to schedule) will be necessary.

b) in case of arrival from a country not concerning to the EU, a certificate of health for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid form will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The competitor must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

3. VETERINARY ASPECTS "A"

VETERINARY REGULATIONS, 10th Edition, 1st June 2006

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 21st Edition, effective 1st January 2005:

Art. 139.1

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (see GRs 141.2), and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 141.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 139.2

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VII
(except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 and 3 months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES
(Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3*/4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016)

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge competitors the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

MEDICATION CONTROL LABORATORY

X. MISCELLANEOUS

1. PROTESTS

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

2. GENERAL CLASSIFICATION AT THE END OF THE COMPETITIONS

Special rating acc. to announcements during the event and information in the rider's folder.

3. Distribution of Prizes and Indemnities

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 130.2 following the last competition at the latest. The scheduled prizes are gross amounts. The total amount of prize money shown for each competition in the schedule must be distributed. If fewer competitors take part in a competition than the number of prizes indicated in the schedule, the President of the Ground Jury is responsible for recalculating the prize money to be distributed.

Per competition 25 % of the competitors receive prize-money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize-money, however at least 5 competitors will receive a prize.

If riders have to be placed equally, the money value of the prizes in kind (e. g. a car) is divided accordingly. Settlement will be done per competitor. Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each competitor binds himself, to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the competitor. Acc. to § 50a Abs. 4 this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the turnover tax from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, 10 % up to 500 EUR, 15 % up to 1,000 EUR, 20 % exceeding 1,000 EUR; plus 5,5 % solidarity fee of the income tax. The tax deduction has to be confirmed on demand. Those foreign competitors being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every competitor himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

5. INSURANCES

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

6. LIABILITY

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, competitors, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. He also declines any liability for theft, damages, fire or other incidents.

7. EVENT'S ORGANISATION

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Delegate of the NF GER and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Jumping Department by the Foreign Judge.

9. Acknowledgement of Regulations and Instructions of OC

By handing in the entries, each owner and all persons belonging to the competitor, each competitor submits himself to the General and Special Regulations valid for the event and to the orders of the show director and his clerks.

10. Ceremonies

The competitors are kindly asked to be prepared for a possible parade without horses in the opening and/or closing ceremony.

For prize giving ceremonies, riders placed 1st – 8th and all drivers – if not announced otherwise – have to participate with their horses in riding/driving cloths according to the rules. Failure to appear without valid excuse entails disqualification.

11. Dogs

Please note, that dogs are not permitted on the Leipzig Fair Ground, including the arena, the exhibition area, the stable and warm-up area and all other places that are used by the OC.

12. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
