- 5a. Competitions 3 and 7 (Classic Tour)
Up to a total number of 25 German riders (excluding point 6 and 7), riders who have either been nominated by the federal trainer jumping or have personally been invited by the organizer at the following rate: per 4 riders having been nominated by the federal trainer jumping one rider may receive a personal invitation. In this number the riders stated under point 2 to 4 are included.
- 5b. Competitions 2, 4 and 8 (Derby Tour)
Up to a total number of 40 German riders (excluding point 6 and 7), riders who have either been nominated by the federal trainer jumping or have personally been invited by the organizer at the following rate: per 4 riders having been nominated by the federal trainer jumping, one rider may receive a personal invitation. In this number the riders stated under point 2 to 4 are included.
6. Competitions 1, 5 and 6 (additional competitions) / Group B
Up to 10 further competitors who have either been nominated by the federal trainer jumping or have personally been invited by the organizer at the following rate: per 1 rider having been nominated by the federal trainer jumping, one rider may receive a personal invitation. Out of competition 1 (opening competition) the best 2 competitors may qualify for competition 3 (Championat of Hamburg).
7. 2 German Juniors/Young Riders who have been nominated by the federal trainer jumping.
8. the FEI has the right to nominate two riders.
9. Foreign riders who are invited through their home NF
Invited NFs: 7
All riders must be listed under the TOP 250 of the FEI-WRL No. 73; 6 competitors, except comp. 2,4, and 8 (Derby-Tour). 6 riders may be invited who are not selected from the top 250 of the FEI World Ranking list No. 73.
10. The number of home riders must not exceed 60%.
11. In addition, 15 % of all foreign CSI competitors may receive a personal invitation (wildcard) from the OC through their NFs.

The number of competitors of the host nation must not exceed 60 % of all starters.

Number of horses per rider: 3 horses (7 years or over) in classes 1 – 8; if 3 horses are entered, one of these horses must be started in the Derby-Tour (2,4,8)
1 horse (7 or 8 years old) in classes 9 – 11

Horses, which are ridden in the youngsters-tour may not be started in other competitions of the CSI4*.

Competitors are invited by the Organising Committee through their NF.

All Competitors:

- Number of horses per rider: 3, however per competition only two horses permitted.
- Admitted are only riders who do not make a living (neither fully nor partly) from riding, dealing, training of horses and/or riders with own horses or horses belonging to other family members. The buying and selling of horses as well as receiving prize money in cash are not forbidden, providing they so not constitute the competitor's only source of income.
- Holding the "Amateur Owner" status, competitors are not barred from other competitions or Championships. As long as the competitor holds the „Amateur Owner“ status, he/she will not be allowed to take part in international or national initial competitions with a height of 1.50 m or greater. The Amateur Owner licence will be issued by the riders' respective NF and has to be applied for by the rider in due time before the begin of the event.
- Amateur-Owner competitors need an "Amateur-Owner licence" of their home NF and has to be applied for in due time before the begin of the event.

VII. FACILITIES OFFERED

1. COMPETITORS

Competitors CSI4* / CSI Amateurs

Accommodation of riders on their own account, except riders who qualify for comp. 7 - Grand Prix. Accommodation of these riders is at the OC expense. If required hotel reservations can be done by OC. Reservations must be made with the entry. For further information call +49 - (0)4172 - 97 19 22 (Susanne Asendorf).

Riders meals (breakfast + one meal) for CSI4* riders at OC cost.

2. GROOMS

Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms, with hot and cold water, will be provided by the OC. All grooms of horses competing in the CSI4* will receive meals free of charge from May 16th dinner to May 20th lunch. Accommodation possibilities for grooms in the stable area are limited. Accommodation has to be requested with the entry.

3. HORSES

CSI4*

A maximum of three boxes will be reserved per rider. Competitors for the Derby-Tour can reserve 4 boxes. The horses will be stabled free of charge in mobile boxes. The competitor himself has to take care of fodder and bedding (first bedding free). EUR 40,- waste disposal per horse. The required number of boxes must be ordered and extra boxes must be paid with the entry. **No boxes can be claimed unless they were ordered in advance.** Cost for the boxes per extra horse: 140,- EUR incl. VAT, extra costs for additional shavings. For horses participating in the event the stabling fee is included in the lump-sum.

Only the assigned stables are allowed to be used. Mangers have to be brought along. For current supply a fee of 60,- EUR incl. VAT will be levied.

International S M L – Tour AMATEUR OWNERS

A maximum of three boxes will be reserved per rider. The horses will be stabled in mobile boxes. The competitor himself has to take care of fodder and bedding (first bedding free). The required number of boxes must be ordered and paid with the entry. No boxes can be claimed unless they were ordered in advance. Only the assigned stables are allowed to be used.

Forage and straw can be bought at prices of the day. Mangers have to be brought along. For current supply a fee of 60,- EUR incl. VAT will be levied.

4. WELCOME

Arrival is possible as of Wednesday, 16th May, 2007, 8 a. m.

The time and date of arrival of riders and horses and their means of transport must be given to the OC to facilitate them on arrival.

5. LOCAL TRANSPORTATION - ARRANGEMENTS FROM HOTEL TO SHOWGROUNDS

Free transportation arrangements from the official show hotels to show grounds will be available from 16th to 20th May, 2007.

6. ADVERTISING AND PUBLICITY ON COMPETITORS AND HORSES

The competitors are authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor in accordance with Art. 136 and in addition for drivers acc. to 910.2, 936.2, 947.3, 960.4 (RG Driving). Only in the Marathon Phase, the competitors are authorised by the OC to display the logo of their personal sponsor on both sides of the marathon carriage, on the dashboard (size 2520 sq.cm) and on the back of the groom (size 1260 sq. cm). The Chief Steward will check that the advertising and publicity on competitors and horses complies with Article 136 of the General Regulations.

VIII. CUSTOMS FORMALITIES/HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

For customs and veterinary formalities for horses from abroad, the OC charges 40,00 EUR per horse.

2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

Every competitor is supplied to deliver all necessary certificates of health for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

- a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Regulations 90/426 of the actual valid form (sample is enclosed to schedule) will be necessary.
- b) in case of arrival from a country not concerning to the EU, a certificate of health for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid form will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The competitor must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

3. VETERINARY ASPECTS "A"

VETERINARY REGULATIONS, 10th Edition, 1st JUNE 2006

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 21st Edition, revision effective June 2006:

Art. 139.1

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (see GRs 141.2), and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 141.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 139.2

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VII

(except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 and 3 months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

(Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3*/4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016)

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge competitors the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

VETERINARY ASPECTS "B"

MEDICATION CONTROL LABORATORY

X. MISCELLANEOUS

1. PROTESTS

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

2. Distribution of Prizes and Indemnities

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 130.2 following the last competition at the latest. The scheduled prizes are gross amounts. The total amount of prize money shown for each competition in the schedule must be distributed. If fewer competitors take part in a competition than the number of prizes indicated in the schedule, the President of the Ground Jury is responsible for recalculating the prize money to be distributed.

Per competition 25 % of the competitors receive prize-money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize-money, however at least 5 competitors will receive a prize.

If riders have to be placed equally, the money value of the prizes in kind (e. g. a car) is divided accordingly. Settlement will be done per competitor. Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each competitor binds himself, to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the competitor. Acc. to § 50a Abs. 4 this also applies to foreign horse owners.

After having deducted the turnover tax from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, 10 % up to 500 EUR, 15 % up to 1,000 EUR, 20 % exceeding 1,000 EUR; plus 5,5 % solidarity fee of the income tax. The tax deduction has to be confirmed on demand. Those foreign competitors being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every competitor himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

3. DOCTOR, FARRIER

During the whole event, medical and veterinary services are available for riders and horses. Farrier and saddler are on hand. All service will be rendered on account of the client.

4. INSURANCES

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

5. LIABILITY

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, competitors, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. He also declines any liability for theft, fire or other incidents.

6. EVENT'S ORGANISATION

The organiser reserves the right

- a) to cancel the whole show in agreement with the FEI and the German NF, if special circumstances necessitate it. In that case all entry fees will be returned.
- b) In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Ground Jury and the NF Delegate to alter the schedule in order to clarify any matters or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible, and they must be reported to the Sec. Gen. of the FEI by the Foreign Judge.

7. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS

Entry right to showgrounds will be handed out to riders, one groom per rider, two grooms per driver and per horse two owners (max. 2 horses per rider acc. to FEI-passport).

8. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Riders wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and Table C) must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These riders will start first in these competitions.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
