**V. INVITATIONS**

**1. CSI5\*: GLOBAL CHAMPIONS TOUR: comp. 1, 3, 5 und 7**

**According to the Invitation System for the Global Champions Tour (GCT) approved by the FEI Bureau in November 2007**

- A. The TOP 30 on the Rolex Rankings No 98. In case of Athletes declining invitations replacements will be selected from the Rolex Rankings No. 98 in descending order. Athletes in this group cannot be lower on the Rolex Rankings No. 98 than 150th place. Requirements obliging organising committees to invite at least two Athletes from each NF are to be relaxed;
- B. 4 of the participants will be home riders and will be selected from the top 150 riders on the Rolex Rankings No 98. In addition one FEI Wild Card will be allocated. The home Athletes are selected by the home National Federation and the FEI Wild Card by the FEI. Should the Organising Committee (OC) not be able to meet its quota of home Athletes in this group, the quota will be filled by inviting additional Athletes from 60% group (= group A) in descending order as described above;
- C. 12 participants who are nominated by the GCT Team. It is not obligatory that these Athletes to be chosen from the Rolex Rankings;
- D. The FEI will apply a certain amount of flexibility in relation to enforcing the rule obliging OCs to have at least 10 NFs represented.
- E. Further Athletes not pre-qualified acc. to A - C qualify through competition 3 up to a total number of 50 Athletes in comp. 7 (Grand Prix).

The Rolex Rankings number 98, established two months prior to this event, will be used for the invitation of Athletes.

One horse per comp. (except comp. 1, two horses admitted). A horse can be started only once per day.

**One groom per Athlete.**

The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting Athletes („masterlist“), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.

**2. CSI3\*: RIDERS TOUR (Derby) and other competitions:**  
**comp. 1, 2, 4, 6, 8, 9-11**

- A. The individual medallists of the last Olympic Games, World Championships and European Championships (Seniors), as well as all winners of the German Jumping Derby holding performance rating S 1 and the winner of the world-cup final 2008/2009.
  - B. All Athletes of the CSI5\* (GLOBAL CHAMPIONS TOUR).
  - C. All Athletes placed 1<sup>st</sup> - 5<sup>th</sup> in the final ranking of the RIDERS TOUR 2008.
  - D. In competitions 1, 2, 4, 6 and 8: German Athletes holding performance rating S 1 who are a member of a riding club linked to the regional associations of Hamburg or Schleswig-Holstein.
  - E. Competitions 2, 4 and 8 (Derby Tour)  
Up to a total number of approx. 60 Athletes
    - a. German Athletes who have either been nominated by the federal trainer jumping or have personally been invited by the organizer at the following rate: per 4 Athletes having been nominated by the federal trainer jumping, one Athlete may receive a personal invitation.
    - b. Foreign Athletes who are invited through their home NF
- In this number the Athletes stated under point A. to D. are included.

The number of Athletes of the host nation must not exceed 60 % of all starters (except comp. 2,4 and 8).

Number of horses per Athlete: 2 horses (7 years or over);  
1 horse (7 or 8 years old) in classes 9 – 11

Horses, which are ridden in the youngsters-tour may not be started in any other competition of the event.

One horse per comp. (except comp. 1, 2 and 4: 2 horses). A horse can be started twice a day.

**Athletes are invited by the Organising Committee through their NF.**  
**One groom per Athlete.**

The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting Athletes („masterlist“), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.

**3. International „(Amateur) Owner“ Competitions, 12-20**

- A. approx. 20 foreign Athletes who will be invited by the organizer through their home NF
  - B. approx. 30 German Athletes who will be invited by the organizer
- All Athletes:
- Number of horses per Athlete: 3, however per competition only two horses permitted.
  - Admitted are only Athletes who do not make a living (neither fully nor partly) from

riding, dealing, training of horses and/or Athletes with own horses or horses belonging to other family members. The buying and selling of horses as well as receiving prize money in cash are not forbidden, providing they so not constitute the Athlete's only source of income.

- Holding the "Amateur Owner" status, Athletes are not barred from other competitions or Championships. As long as the Athlete holds the „Amateur Owner“ status, he/she will not be allowed to take part in international or national initial competitions with a height of 1.50 m or greater. The Amateur Owner licence will be issued by the Athletes' respective NF and has to be applied for by the Athlete in due time before the begin of the event.
- Amateur-Owner Athletes need an "Amateur-Owner licence" of their home NF and has to be applied for in due time before the begin of the event.

## VI. FACILITIES OFFERED

### A) ATHLETES

#### **Athletes CSI5\* / CSI3\* / CSI Amateurs**

Accommodation (max. 4 overnight stays) of Athletes taking part in the CSI5\* is at the OC's expense from 20. to 24.05.2009. Accommodation for all other Athletes will be on their own expense. If required hotel reservations can be done by OC.

Reservations must be made with the entry. For further information call +49 - (0)172 – 45 23 226 (Susanne Asendorf).

Athletes meals (breakfast + one meal) for all Athletes at OC cost from from May 20<sup>th</sup> (dinner) to May 24<sup>th</sup> (lunch).

### B) GROOMS

Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms, with hot and cold water, will be proved by the OC. All grooms of horses competing in the CSI5\* and CSI3\* will receive meals free of charge from May 20<sup>th</sup> (dinner) to May 24<sup>th</sup> (lunch).. Accommodation possibilities for grooms in the stable area are limited. Accommodation has to be requested with the entry.

### C) HORSES / PONIES

Transport expenses to be paid by Athlete.

#### **1 CSI5\* / CSI3\***

A maximum of three boxes will be reserved per Athlete. The horses will be stabled free of charge in mobile boxes. Only boxes can be made available for horses being started in the event. The Athlete himself has to take care of fodder and bedding. The required number of boxes must be ordered and extra boxes must be paid with the entry.

**No boxes can be claimed unless they were ordered in advance.** For horses taking part in the CSI5\* bedding will be free of charge (6 straw, 4 shavings, 4 hay), for horses taking part in the CSI3\* only first bedding (straw) will be free of charge. EUR 40,- (incl. VAT) waste disposal per horse will be levied. Cost for the boxes per extra horse: 140,- EUR incl. VAT. Forage and straw as well as shavings can be bought on site; hay: 7.00 €, shavings 14,00 €, straw: 4,00 €. Only the assigned stables are allowed to be used. Mangers have to be brought along. For current supply a fee of 60,- EUR incl. VAT will be levied. There will be no reimbursement of transport charges.

#### **2 International S M I – Tour AMATEUR OWNERS**

A maximum of three boxes will be reserved per Athlete. The horses will be stabled in mobile boxes. The Athlete himself has to take care of fodder and bedding (first bedding free). The required number of boxes must be ordered and paid with the entry. No boxes can be claimed unless they were ordered in advance. Only the assigned stables are allowed to be used. Forage and straw can be bought on site:

hay: 7.00 €, shavings 14,00 €, straw: 4,00 €. Mangers have to be brought along.  
For current supply a fee of 60,- EUR incl. VAT will be levied.

**D) WELCOME**

Arrival is possible as of Wednesday, 20<sup>th</sup> May, 2009, 8 a. m.  
The time and date of arrival of Athletes and horses and their means of transport must be given to the OC to facilitate them on arrival.

**E) LOCAL TRANSPORTATION - ARRANGEMENTS FROM HOTEL TO SHOWGROUNDS**

Free transportation arrangements from the official show hotels to show grounds will be available from April 20<sup>th</sup> to 24<sup>th</sup> May, 2009.

**F) ADVERTISING AND PUBLICITY ON ATHLETES AND HORSES**

The Athletes are authorized to carry the logo of their personal sponsor on the saddle cloth in accordance with Art. 135. The Chief Steward will check that the advertising and publicity on Athletes and horses complies with Article 135 of the General Regulations.

Costs for current supply and forage will be invoiced in addition on site for all Athletes.  
12,50 CHF per horse will be charged as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

- EUR 1.500,00 (incl. VAT) per horse including entry and MCP-fee. Per horse each Athlete will get one entry right to the VIP-Area. The amount has to be paid on receipt of the invoice before the event begins. Costs for current supply and forage will be invoiced in addition on site for all Athletes.

The entries of foreign Athletes have to be made through the HippoBase online entry system. Discipline responsables of National Federations who do not yet have a user account are requested to send their full name, email and phone to support@hippobase.com.

Please add your Athletes to the system, but keep in mind that they have to have the appropriate qualification. We reserve the right to limit the number of Athletes for each country. All Athletes have to be entered with address, phone and email.

Closing dates of entries have to be adhered to. Late entries or alterations can only be accepted after consultation with the OC.

German Athletes have to use the required Athletes' entry forms or have to enter through the German online entry system (NeOn).

The closing dates of entries have to be adhered to. Subsequent changes will only be accepted on consultation with the OC.

The number and kind of required boxes, the number of required electricity as well as the required number of hotel rooms (with date of arrival and departure) etc. has to be given with the entries. If the requested information is missing, the OC reserves per horse entered one box. The costs will be charged with the final account without fail. Hotel rooms can only be booked if they have been ordered in advance.

For withdrawals after the date of definite entries or no-shows the Athlete or the respective NF will be held liable to reimburse the OC for the actual financial loss incurred by the OC (i.e. stabling and hotel expenses) as a result of the late withdrawal or no-show.

## **VIII. CUSTOMS FORMALITIES/HEALTH REQUIREMENTS**

### **1. CUSTOMS FORMALITIES**

For customs and veterinary formalities for horses from abroad, the OC charges 35,00 EUR per horse.

### **2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES**

Every Athlete is supplied to deliver all necessary certificates of health for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

- a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Reglements 90/426 of the actual valid form (sample is enclosed to schedule) will be necessary.
- b) in case of arrival from a country not concerning to the EU, a certificate of health for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid form will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The Athlete must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

### **3. VETERINARY ASPECTS "A"**

VETERINARY REGULATIONS, 11<sup>th</sup> Edition, effective 1<sup>st</sup> January 2009

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 23<sup>rd</sup> edition, effective 1<sup>st</sup> January 2009:

Art 137.1

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (see GRs 139.2), and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 139.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art 137.2

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET REGS ANNEX VII

(except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 and 3 months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

(Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3\*/4\*, CSIs (3\*, 4\*, 5\*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the

discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016)

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

~~MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)~~

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge Athletes the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

## **X. MISCELLANEOUS**

By handing in the entries, each owner and person responsible and by participating in the event, every Athlete submits to the General and Special Regulations valid for the event and to the orders of the show direction.

### **1. PROTESTS**

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

### **2. PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY**

8 Athletes to present themselves for the prize-giving ceremony of each competition.

The Athletes must take part in the prize giving ceremony on the horse they started in the corresponding competition (exception are only possible with the approval of the Ground Jury and the OC).

Bridle according to Art. 260. On order of the OC the Athletes must immediately assemble for the prize giving ceremony. No prize money will be paid to an Athlete who does not take part in the prize giving ceremony and/or Press Conferences without being excused by the Ground Jury and the OC.

**For the prize-giving ceremony of the GCT Grand Prix and the Press Conference, the Athletes are obliged to follow carefully the instructions of the OC. Only the 3 best riders of the Grand Prix are invited for the prize giving ceremony. After the prize giving ceremony the 3 best Athletes have to go immediately to the Press Conference.**

The owner of the winning horse is invited to the prize giving ceremony for the Grand Prix (comp. 7) and for the Derby (comp. 8).

### **3. Distribution of Prizes and Indemnities**

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 127/128 following the last competition at the latest. The scheduled prizes are gross amounts.

Settlement will be done per Athlete. Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each Athlete binds himself to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the Athlete. Acc. to § 50a EstG this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the turnover tax from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money, as a rule the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, 15 % exceeding 250 EUR (in force as of 01.01.2009); plus solidarity fee (at present 5.5 %) of the income tax amount. Travelling expenses being taken over or reimbursed are only regarded as revenues if they exceed the actual costs and the reimbursement for additional meal allowances acc. to § 4 Abs. 5 Satz 1 Nr. 5 EstG. The tax deduction has to be certified on demand. Those foreign Athletes being exempted from tax deduction are

kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every Athlete himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

#### **4. INSURANCES**

All owners and Athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

#### **5. LIABILITY**

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, Athletes, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. He also declines any liability for theft, damages, fire or other incidents.

#### **6. EVENT'S ORGANISATION**

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Delegate of the NF GER (, the Chefs d'Equipe) and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all Athletes and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Jumping Department by the Foreign Judge.

#### **7. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS**

Entry right to showgrounds will be handed out to Athletes, one groom per Athlete and per horse two owners (max. 2 horses per Athlete acc. to FEI-passport).  
Entry Right to stable area acc. to VR Art. 1005.2.5.

Athletes wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and Table C) must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These Athletes will start first in these competitions.

#### **13. STABLE SECURITY**

**THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT**

**FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
