B. Further Foreign Athletes (up to a total number of approx. 25 foreign athletes)

 - b) 50 % are free (ranked or unranked riders).
2. 15 % of all foreign riders may receive a wildcard; however, these riders must be selected from the top 600 of the Rolex Rankings No.104.
3. The FEI has the right to nominate two athletes

C. Further German Athletes (up to a total number of approx. 30 German athletes):

1. 2 German Juniors/Young riders, who in agreement with the organizer and the federal trainer jumping will be nominated by the federal trainer jumping.
2. 2 athlete belonging to a riding club of the regional federation of Bavaria and who in agreement with the organizer and the regional federation of Bavaria will be nominated by the federal trainer jumping.
3. Up to a total number of approx. 30 athletes:
German athletes either nominated by the federal trainer jumping or personally invited by the organizer to the following ratio: per four athletes nominated by the federal trainer jumping one athlete can be personally invited by the organizer.

The share of German athletes must not exceed 60 %.

D. German and Foreign athletes (Group B – comp. 1-5)

1. Up to 5 further athletes who have either been nominated by the federal trainer jumping or have personally been invited by the organizer at the following rate: per 1 athlete having been nominated by the federal trainer jumping one athlete may receive a personal invitation These athletes may only take part in comp. 1 to 5.
2. From competition 23 (national competition) athlete/horse combinations placed 1st to 6th will qualify for competition 3 and 4,.

E. For competition 8 and 9 (Final 2009 Bioranch Youngster Cup) the following horses are pre-qualified:

The athletes will be informed by the organizer. Horses could qualify at the following events:

- CSI München Riem, 21st to 24th May 2009

- CSI Paderborn, 10th to 13th September 2009
- CSI Hannover, 22nd to 25th October 2009

At this qualifying event points will be awarded acc. to the Worldcup system.

Point system as follows:

1st place 20 points

2nd place 17 points
3rd place 15 points
4th place 13 points
5th place 12 points
6th place 11 points etc.

All starts of a horse count, regardless of the athlete. There is no minimum or maximum number the horses must have started. The horse qualifies for the final.

The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting athletes („masterlist“), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.

Admitted Athletes CSI Amateurs (comp. 10-18)

Admitted Athletes:

1. Approx. 10 foreign Athletes, who have been invited by the OC through their home NF
2. Approx. 30 German Athletes, who have been invited by the OC.
3. All Athletes:
 - Number of horses per Athlete: 3 horses of 6 years or over, however, max. 2 horses per competition.
 - The Athlete (Small and Medium Tour – 14 years and older / Large group – athletes up to 21 years and older) must be the owner of the horse(s) with which he/she competes. Ownership may be extended to family members.
 - Athletes must have an “Amateur Owner’s” license of their respective NF, such a licence will only be granted by NFs to those Athletes who have formally signed a statement that he/she does not earn money for riding other people’s horses, giving riding lessons, or for publicity or commercial purposes, etc.
 - An Amateur Owner licence will only be granted by NFs to those Athletes who have formally signed a statement that he/she does not earn money for riding other people’s horses, giving riding lessons, or for publicity or commercial purposes, etc.
 - The buying and selling of horses, as well as receiving prize money in cash, are not forbidden providing they do not constitute the competitor’s mainly source of income.
 - Athletes participating in the CSI Amateurs may not start in any other international competition of the event.
 - Holding the “Amateur Owner” status, does not bar athletes from taking part in other competitions or Championships. As long as the athlete holds the “Amateur Owner” status, he/she will not be allowed to take part in international or national initial competitions with an height of 1.50 m or greater.

Meals from 03.12. to 06.12.2009 in the VIP-area or the canteen at the OC's expense.

2. Grooms

Accommodation requests have to be handed in with the entries. Accommodation from 03.12. to 06.12.2009 will be at the athletes' own expense.

In the show office, each groom (one groom per athlete) will receive meal vouchers for each day of the show. All grooms of horses competing in the CSI4* will receive meals vouchers for each day of the event, which can be redeemed in the canteen. Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms will be provided by the OC.

3. HORSES

Horses, taking place in the CSI competitions have to be stabled on the showgrounds. For the athletes of the CSI4* boxes for max. 3 horses and the qualified youngsters (max. 2 youngster) may be reserved and for the CSI-Amateurs max. 3 horses per athlete. Stabling arrangements, from 03.12.09 to 06.12.09 at the cost of the OC (incl. 1st bedding (shavings or straw)). Boxes may only be reserved for horses taking part in the event. The necessary number of boxes has to be bindingly ordered when handing in the entries. EUR 40,- (incl. VAT) waste disposal per horse will be charged. The OC will reserve and charge as many boxes as horses have been entered (max. 5 for CSI4* athletes and max. 3 for CSI Amateurs athletes), unless the athlete or respective national NF will reserve the correct number of stables two weeks before the event starts. A stable fee of € 140,00 (incl. VAT) per extra tackbox will be charged. The allocated stalls have to be used only. Forage, hay and further bedding (straw € 5,00, hay € 7,00 and shavings € 14,00 incl. VAT) can be bought with the stable manager.

For the electric supply, a non-recurring fee of € 60,00 (incl. VAT) has to be paid for in the show office. Sufficiently long cables have to be brought along by the grooms. A delegate of the OC is authorized to collect bad cables or devices.

Transport expenses to be paid by the athlete.

4. WELCOME

Stables will be available as of Wednesday, 02.12.2009, as of 4:00 p. m. The time and date of arrival of athletes and horses and their means of transport must be given to the OC in order to facilitate them on arrival. Horses have to leave on Monday, 07.12.2009, 8:00 a. m. the latest.

5. LOCAL TRANSPORTATION - ARRANGEMENTS FROM HOTEL TO SHOWGROUNDS

6. ADVERTISING AND PUBLICITY ON ATHLETES AND HORSES (Art. 135)

The athletes are authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor in accordance with Art. 135. The Chief Steward will check that the advertising and publicity on athletes and horses complies with Article 135 of the General Regulations.

Entry fee: per athlete/per horse 1.500 € incl. VAT; this amount includes entry fee, LK-fee per reserved starting place, MCP fee per horse, 1 VIP card for the weekend of the event. The entry fee has to be handed in together with the entry.

- Entries without this information will be rejected.
- Closing dates of entries have to be adhered to. Later alterations will only be accepted on consultation with the OC!
- The number and kind of boxes, the number of needed power connections as well as the needed number of hotel rooms (with date of arrival and departure) etc. have to be handed in together with the entries. If no

information regarding hotel, number of boxes and/or electricity the OC reserves one box per horse entered. The expenses have to be paid in any case at the final settlement of accounts. Hotel rooms will only be booked if ordered in writing.

Foreign athletes will be entered through their home NF.

The entries of foreign athletes have to be made through the **HippoBase online entry system**. Discipline responsables of National Federations who do not yet have a user account are requested to send their full name, email and phone to support@hippobase.com.

Please add your athletes to the system, but keep in mind that they have to have the appropriate qualification. We reserve the right to limit the number of athletes for each country. All athletes have to be entered with address, phone and email.

For withdrawals after the date of definite entries or no-shows the athlete or the respective NF will be held liable to reimburse the OC for the actual financial loss incurred by the OC (i.e. stabling and hotel expenses) as a result of the late withdrawal or no-show.

Customs and veterinary fees will not be taken over. For customs and veterinary formalities for horses from abroad, the OC charges 40,00 EUR per horse.

2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

Every athlete is supplied to deliver all necessary certificates of health for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

- a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Reglements 90/426 of the actual valid form (sample is enclosed to schedule) will be necessary.
- b) in case of arrival from a country not concerning to the EU, a certificate of

health for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid from will be necessary.
A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The athlete must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.
The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.
In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.
Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

All horses taking part at this event must be presented during the first horse inspection otherwise they are not permitted to participate.

3. VETERINARY ASPECTS "A"

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 23rd edition, effective 1st January 2009:

Art. 137.1

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (see GRs 139.2), and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 139.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 137.2

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VII (except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 and 3 months apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

(Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3*/4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016)

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge Athletes the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

MEDICATION CONTROL LABORATORY (Vet. Regs. Art. 1021)

X. MISCELLANEOUS

By handing in the entries, each owner or his delegate, by taking part in the event each athlete submits himself to the General and Special Regulations valid for the event and to the orders of the show direction.

1. PROTESTS

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

2. CLOSING TIME OF DECLARATION

Closing time of declaration (incl. name of athlete and horses) will be for all competition of the next day, the previous evening by 6:00 p. m.

3. PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY

The OC reserves the right to carry out single prize giving ceremonies at a

later time. The athletes placed 1st to 5th are obliged to attend the respective ceremony. The athlete must take part in the prize giving ceremony on the horse they started in the corresponding competition (exception are only possible with the approval of the ground Jury and the OC).

On order of the OC the athletes must immediately assemble for the prize giving ceremony. No prize money will be paid to an athlete who does not take part in the prize giving ceremony and/or press conferences without being excused by the Ground jury and the OC.

The owner of the winning horse/pony is invited to the prize giving ceremony for the Grand Prix (comp. 7).

RIDERS TOUR - Individual Rating:

To be eligible for the final individual rating a athlete has to compete in the CSI München "Munich Indoors" 2009, otherwise the next best athlete moves up.

To determine the "Rider of the Year":

The max 5 best results acc. to the points will be taken into consideration for the final rating from the rating competitions at CSI5*/4* (Derby) Hamburg, CSI4* Wiesbaden, CSI4* Paderborn, CSI4* Münster, CSI4* Hannover, CSI4* München-Indoors.

If after the last Riders Tour leg two or more athletes are placed equal acc. to points in the final individual rating for the "Rider of the Year", the highest number of 1st places in Riders Tour Individual Qualifiers will be decisive. Will then still be equality of places, the highest number of 2nd places in Riders Tour Individual Qualifiers will be decisive etc.

The best 5 athletes have to present themselves for the prize-giving ceremony of each competition.

4. Distribution of Prizes and Indemnities

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 127/128 following the last competition at the latest. The scheduled prizes are gross amounts.

Settlement will be done per Athlete. Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each Athlete binds himself to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the Athlete. Acc. to § 50a EstG this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the turnover tax from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money, as a rule the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, 15 % exceeding 250 EUR (in force as of 01.01.2009); plus solidarity fee (at present 5.5 %) of the income tax amount. Travelling expenses being taken over or reimbursed are only regarded as revenues if they exceed the actual costs and the reimbursement for additional meal allowances acc. to § 4 Abs. 5 Satz 1 Nr. 5 EstG. The tax deduction has to be certified on demand. Those foreign Athletes being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every Athlete himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

5. INSURANCES

All owners and athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses.

They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

6. LIABILITY

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, athletes, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. The OC is liable in case of intent, gross negligence as well as in case of injury to life, body or health and in further cases he is liable for compelling legal liability acc. to the legal requirements. Furthermore he also declines any liability for theft, damages, fire or other incidents.

7. EVENT'S ORGANISATION

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Delegate of the NF GER (, the Chefs d'Equipe) and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all athletes and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Jumping Department by the Foreign Judge.

8. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS

Entry right to showgrounds will be handed out to athletes, one partner per athlete, one groom per athlete and per horse two owners (acc. to FEI-passport) (applies only to athletes of the CSI4*), provided the names have been given to the show office before the event starts. This rules applies only to athletes of the international competitions.

Entry Right to stable area acc. to VR Art. 1005.2.5.

9. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Athletes wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and Table C) must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These athletes will start first in these competitions.

**THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT
FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
