a) Classes 01-06 and 9-11:

- up to 3 further foreign Athletes are admitted. Foreign Athletes will be invited through their respective home NF.

c) in addition for classes 02,03,04,05:

- Athletes who are placed 1st – 3rd in class 30 (national class) (Article 137.1 and 2 – FEI passports - have to be adhered to!).
- If any of these Athletes have already received an invitation acc. to V.A.a), the next Athlete acc. to the placement in class 30 will be qualified.
- Moving up due to a qualified Athlete having withdrawn is not possible.

Max. four horses per Athlete are allowed; three horses for the CSI classes and one horse for the youngster tour. Each horse may be started twice per day, except Youngster, only once per day.

The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting Athletes („masterlist“), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.

B) CAI-W

Open to 5 drivers of the Top Ten Drivers 2009 and one driver from the home nation with wild card jointly allocated acc. to WC rules driving by the German NF and the organizer. A second/third wild card may be allocated by the FEI either to an Overseas Driver, or, upon request from the Organising Committee, to a further Home Driver, or to the FEI WORLD CUP™ winner 2008/2009 or to the winner of the last FEI WORLD CUP™ (Leipzig 2009) or to the leader in the actual point standings. Any Driver who competes in a FEI World Cup™ as a Wild Card entry cannot earn FEI World Cup™ points from his result from that event.

Each driver may enter 5 horses.

C) Admitted Athletes CSI Amateurs (comp. 14-22)

Admitted Athletes:

1. Approx. 10 foreign Athletes, who have been invited by the OC through their home NF
2. Approx. 30 German Athletes, who have been invited by the OC.
3. All Athletes:
 - Number of horses per Athlete: 3 horses of 6 years or over, however, max. 2 horses per competition.
 - The Athlete must be the owner of the horse(s) with which he/she competes. Ownership may be extended to family members.
 - Athletes must have an "Amateur Owner's" license of their respective NF, such a licence will only be granted by NFs to those Athletes who have formally signed a statement that he/she does not earn money for riding other people's horses, giving riding lessons, or for publicity or commercial purposes, etc.
 - An Amateur Owner licence will only be granted by NFs to those Athletes who have formally signed a statement that he/she does not earn money for riding other people's horses, giving riding lessons, or for publicity or commercial purposes, etc.
 - The buying and selling of horses, as well as receiving prize money in cash, are not forbidden providing they do not constitute the Athlete's mainly source of income.
 - Athletes participating in the CSI Amateurs may not start in any other international competition of the event.
 - Holding the "Amateur Owner" status, does not bar athletes from taking part in other competitions or Championships. As long as the athlete holds the "Amateur Owner" status, he/she will not be allowed to take part in international or national initial competitions with a height of 1.50 m or greater.

VI. Facilities Offered

1. Athletes CSI-W/CSI Amateurs

CSI Athletes get special conditions at the Leipzig Marriott Hotel and Renaissance Hotel. Special conditions for all Athletes may only be granted if the reservation is sent with the entries to En Garde.

All extras (e.g. drinks, phone additional charge for double rooms etc.) will be at the Athletes' own account.

Meals: VIP area (hall 1) and grooms' catering at OCs expense.

2. Grooms CSI-W/CSI Amateurs

One groom per Athlete.

Meals: Breakfast and dinner in hall 3 near the stables; lunch at the casino in the administration building at OC expense.

Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms with hot and cold water will be provided by the OC.

3. Stable Area / CSI-W/CSI Amateurs

Size of boxes according to FEI rules (3 x 3 m).

Stabling will be free of charge; for **additional** horses a fee of 140 € per horse (incl. VAT) will be levied, first bedding included. (Athletes of the CSI5*-W additional get 4 bales of straw or 4x shavings as well as 4x hay for free)

Hay, straw and shavings can be purchased with the stable manager.

Prices incl. VAT: straw 4,00 €, hay 7 €, shavings 14 €.

For waste disposal a fee of 40,00 € will be charged per box.

4. Athletes/Grooms CAI-W

Drivers receive free accommodation for themselves and two grooms (in double rooms) for 2 overnight stays from 22.01 – 24.01.10.

Name and sex of the grooms have to be given with the entries.

Meals: Breakfast and dinner in hall 3 near the stables; lunch in the casino in the administration building.

Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms with hot and cold water will be provided by the OC.

5. Stable Area / Horses CAI-W

Stabling for five CAI horses (including 1st bedding) will be free of charge. Forage, hay, straw and shavings can be purchased with the stable manager. Prices incl. VAT: straw 4,00 €, hay 7 €, shavings 14 €.

For additional horses a fee of 140 € per horse (incl. VAT) will be levied, first bedding included. EUR 40,- waste disposal per horse.

Each driver will receive transport expenses at the rate of € 2.- per km one way (maximum € 2,000.-)

6. Transporters and Live-in-Caravans

The license plate and the size of transporters/live-in-caravans has to be given with the entries.

Electric supply for CSI/CAI Athletes will be charged with 60 € incl. VAT. Electricity has to be ordered together with the entry.

7. Arrival / Departure

The OC facilitates Athletes and grooms on their arrival and on their departure. Therefore the OC needs date, time and means of transport of arrival and departure of Athletes and horses.

The stables will be available as of Wednesday, 20th January 2010, 3.00 p.m. and have to be cleared by Monday, 25th January 2010, 08.00 a.m.

8. Shuttle Service

A Shuttle-Service from the show ground to the hotel will be arranged.

9. ADVERTISING AND PUBLICITY ON ATHLETES AND HORSES

The Athletes are authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor on the saddle cloth in accordance with Art. 135 of the General Regulations and Art. 913.3 of the Drivers Regulations. The Chief Steward will check that the advertising and publicity on Athletes and horses complies with Article 135 of the General Regulations or Art. 913.3 of the Driving Rules.

Entries without this information will not be accepted.

- The entries of foreign Athletes have to be made through the HippoBase online entry system. Discipline responsables of National Federations who do not yet have a user account are requested to send their full name, email and phone to support@hippobase.com.
- German Athletes have to use the Athletes' entry cheques with the valid horse stickers or use the German online system NeOn.
- Closing dates of entries have to be adhered to. Later changes will only be accepted on approval of the OC.
- The number and kind of required stables, the number of required electric supplies and the required accommodation (kind, arrival and departure date) have to be given with the entries.

- If the entry does not contain information on number of boxes and/or electric supply, the OC reserves one electric supply per Athlete and per horse entered one box. All expenses will be charged to the Athlete's account. Hotel rooms are only booked when ordered in writing.

Per Athlete/per horse comp. 1-8: 350,00 EUR; Youngster comp. 9-11: 250,00 EUR; included VAT.

Athletes have to pay 12,50 CHF for MCP-fee.

Further fees will be charged with the final invoice: forage, bedding, electricity and waste disposals.

CSI-Amateurs

Entry fee: per Athlete/per horse 1.500,00 EUR inkl VAT; this amount includes entry fee, LK-fee per reserved starting place, MCP fee per horse, stabling fee, 1 VIP card for the weekend of the event. The entry fee has to be handed in together with the entry.

Further fees will be charged with the final invoice: forage, bedding, electricity.

CAI-W

Entry fee per four-in-hand: 500,00 EUR, included VAT; this amount includes: entry fee, LK fee and MCP-fee per horse.

Further fees will be charged with the final invoice: forage, bedding, electricity.

If any Athlete withdraws after the date of definite entries, the Athlete or his/her home NF will be held liable to reimburse the OC for the actual financial loss suffered by the OC (i.e. limited to stabling and hotel expenses) as a result of the late withdrawal.

VIII. CUSTOMS FORMALITIES/HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

1. Customs Formalities

According Vet. Reg. Art. 1004.2 the relevant National Veterinarian Authorities have to be informed four weeks in advance to assure a smooth frontier crossing of the horses from abroad.

For questions pertaining to the veterinary and animal diseases legislation for horses from abroad and regarding the horses' transportation, the following transport agency is ready to assist:

Custom and veterinary fees will not be taken over. A fee of 30 EUR per horse is charged for customs formalities

2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

Every Athlete is supplied to deliver all necessary certificates of health for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

- a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Regulations 90/426 of the actual valid form (sample is enclosed to schedule) will be necessary.
- b) in case of arrival from a country not concerning to the EU, a certificate of health for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid form will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The Athlete must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

3. VETERINARY ASPECTS "A"

VETERINARY REGULATIONS, 11th Edition, 1st January 2009

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 23rd edition, effective January 2009:

Art. 137.1

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (see GRs 139.2), and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 139.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 137.2

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VI

(except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

From 1 January 2005 onwards, influenza vaccination for all horses competing in FEI competitions requires a vaccination within six months + 21 days of the competition.

1. All horses intending to participate in FEI competition must have at least received an initial primary course of two vaccinations, given between 21 and 92 days apart. Thereafter, a third dose (referred to as the first booster) must be given within 6 months + 21 days after the date of administration of the second primary dose, with at least annual boosters given subsequently (i.e. within one year of the last dose).

2. If the horse is scheduled to take part in an FEI competition, the last booster must have been given within 6 months + 21 days of arrival at the FEI event. (The 21-day window has been provided to enable vaccination requirements to fit in with the competition schedule).

3. No vaccination shall be given within 7 days of the day of arrival at the FEI event.

4. All horses that were certified as correctly vaccinated under the previous FEI equine influenza vaccination rule prior to 1st January 2005, do not need to start a primary course again provided that they have complied with the previous rule of primary course and annual re-vaccinations and the new rule of a booster vaccination within 6 months + 21 days of the day of arrival at the FEI event.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

(Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3*/4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016)

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge Athletes the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

MEDICATION CONTROL LABORATORY

X. MISCELLANEOUS

1. PROTESTS

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- (= 100 EUR).

2. GENERAL CLASSIFICATION AT THE END OF THE COMPETITIONS and PRIZE – CLASSIFICATION

Special rating acc. to announcements during the event and information in the Athlete's folder.

3. CEREMONY

Athletes are asked to be prepared to take part in a parade without horse during the opening and/or closing ceremony.

Provided it will not be announced otherwise, the Athletes placed 1st to 8th (CSI-W), 1 – 5 (CSI Amateurs) and all drivers (CAI-W) have to attend the respective prize giving ceremony with their horses/vehicles in accurate riding/driving dress. Not attend the ceremony without valid excuse will entail disqualification.

The owner of the winning horse will be invited to the prize-giving ceremony of the Grand Prix (comp. 8).

4. Distribution of Prizes and Indemnities

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 127/128 following the last competition at the latest. The scheduled prizes are gross amounts.

Settlement will be done per Athlete. Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each Athlete binds himself to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the Athlete. Acc. to § 50a EstG this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the VAT from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money, as a rule the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, 15 % exceeding 250 EUR (in force as of 01.01.2009); plus solidarity fee (at present 5.5 %) of the income amount. Travelling expenses being taken over or reimbursed are only regarded as revenues if they exceed the actual costs and the reimbursement for additional meal allowances acc. to § 4 Abs. 5 Satz 1 Nr. 5 EstG.

The tax deduction has to be certified on demand. Those foreign Athlete being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every Athlete himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

Should the final settlement of accounts show a credit balance, the respective amount will be settled by a cheque.

Should the final settlement of accounts show a debit, the respective amount has to be paid in the show office in cash in EURO. Foreign currencies will be accepted at the conversion rate available in the show office. Athletes from foreign countries in which the EURO is the official currency, cheques will be accepted. Cheques in other currencies cannot be accepted. All bank charges will be at the expense of the Athlete.

5. INSURANCES

All owners and Athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

6. LIABILITY

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, Athletes, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. The OC is liable in case of intent, gross negligence as well as in case of injury to life, body or health and in further cases he is liable for compelling legal liability acc. to the legal requirements. Furthermore he also declines any liability for theft, damages, fire or other incidents.

7. EVENT'S ORGANISATION

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Delegate of the NF GER (, the Chefs d'Equipe) and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all Athletes and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Jumping or Driving Department by the Foreign Judge. In special circumstances (i. e. outbreak of FMD etc.) the OC reserves the right, to cancel or to break off the event in agreement with the FEI and the NF GER.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**
