3. One athlete belonging to regional federation of Westphalia and who in agreement with the organizer and the regional federation of Westphalia will be nominated by the federal trainer jumping.

4. Up to a total number of approx. 25 riders.
German athletes either nominated by the federal trainer jumping or personally invited by the organizer to the following ration: per 4 athletes nominated by the federal trainer jumping one athlete can be personally invited by the organizer.

D) Further 10 athletes only for the Medium Tour (comp. 1,2,3)/B-Group

Athletes either nominated by the federal trainer jumping or personally invited by the organizer to the following ration: per rider nominated by the federal trainer jumping one rider can be personally invited by the organizer.

Max. 4 horses per rider are allowed; three horses of 7 years and over for the CSI classes and one horse for the youngster tour 7 or 8 year old horses. The young horses are not allowed to take part in any other competition of the event.

The number of home riders must not exceed 60 %.

The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting athletes („masterlist“), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.

Admitted Athletes CSI Amateurs A + B (comp. 10-18)

Admitted Athletes:

1. Approx. 20 foreign Athletes from approx. 5 nations, who have been invited by the OC through their home NF
2. Approx. 30 German Athletes, who have been invited by the OC.
3. All Athletes:
 - Number of horses per Athlete: 3 horses of 6 years or over, however, max. 2 horses per competition.
 - The Athlete must be the owner of the horse(s) with which he/she competes. Ownership may be extended to family members.
 - Athletes must have an "Amateur Owner's" license of their respective NF, such a licence will only be granted by NFs to those Athletes who have formally signed a statement that he/she does not earn money for riding other people's horses, giving riding lessons, or for publicity or commercial purposes, etc.
 - An Amateur Owner licence will only be granted by NFs to those Athletes who have formally signed a statement that he/she does not earn money for riding other people's horses, giving riding lessons, or for publicity or commercial purposes, etc.
 - The buying and selling of horses, as well as receiving prize money in cash, are not forbidden providing they do not constitute the Athlete's mainly source of income.
 - Athletes participating in the CSI Amateurs may not start in any other international competition of the event.
 - Holding the "Amateur Owner" status, does not bar athletes from taking part in other competitions or Championships. As long as the athlete holds the "Amateur Owner" status, he/she will not be allowed to take part in international or national initial competitions with a height of 1.50 m or greater.

VI. FACILITIES OFFERED

1. ATHLETES

Meals from 09.09.10 to 12.09.10 in the VIP-tent or the canteen at the OC's expense.

2. GROOMS

In the show office, each groom (one groom per athlete) will receive meal vouchers for each day of the show. Accommodation will be made available upon request at athlete's expense. All grooms of horses the international competitions will receive meals free of charge from 09.09.10 (lunch) to 12.09.10 (lunch). Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms will be provided by the OC.

Caravans and live-in lorries can be parked near the stables (as far as space will be sufficient). If possible, the stable manager will provide for electric supply (no self-service!).

For the electric supply, a non-recurring fee of € 60,00 (incl. VAT) has to be paid for in the show office. Sufficiently long cables have to be brought along by the grooms. A delegate of the OC is authorized to collect bad cables or devices.

3. HORSES

Stabling arrangements, from 08.09.10 to 12.09.10 at the cost of the OC (first bedding – shavings or straw – included).

Horses, taking place in the CSI competitions have to be stabled on the showgrounds. Boxes for max. 4 horses (CSI4*) and 3 horses (CSI-Amateurs) may be reserved. Only boxes may be made available for horses being started in the event. The necessary number of boxes has to be ordered when handing in the entries. No boxes can be claimed unless they were ordered in advance. The allocated stalls have to be used only. For waste disposal a fee of EUR 40,- per horse will be charged. For boxes for horses additionally brought to the event and for tax boxes a fee of € 140,00 (incl. VAT) will be charged. Forage, hay and further bedding (straw € 4,00, hay € 7,00 and shavings € 14,00 incl. VAT) can be bought at prices of the day with the stable manager. The OC grants no reimbursement of transport charges.

German athletes have to use their athletes cheque and the valid horse stickers or the entries have to be entered in the German online system NeOn.

Entry fee CSI4* EUR 400,00 per horse (comp. 1-6)
Entry fee Youngster EUR 250,00 per horse (comp. 7-9)

CHF 12.50 per horse will be charged as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

Costs for current supply and forage will be invoiced in addition on site for all athletes.

CSI-Amateurs

Entry fee: per athlete/per horse 1.500 € incl. VAT; this amount includes entry fee, MCP fee per horse, 1 VIP card for the weekend of the event. The entry fee has to be paid on receipt of the invoice.

Closing dates of entries have to be adhered to, Late entries or alterations will only be accepted on consultation with the OC.

The number and kind of the boxes needed, the number of needed electricity as well as the number of needed hotel rooms (incl. date of arrival and departure) etc. have to be given with the entries. If the entries do not include any information with regard to hotel, number of boxes and/or electricity, the OC reserves one box per horse entered. The costs have to be paid without fail on settlement of accounts. Hotel rooms will only be booked on order.

For withdrawals after the date of definite entries or no-shows the athlete or the respective NF will be held liable to reimburse the OC for the actual financial loss incurred by the OC (i.e. stabling and hotel expenses) as a result of the late withdrawal or no-show.

VIII. CUSTOMS FORMALITIES/HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

For customs and veterinary formalities for horses from abroad, the OC charges 40,00 EUR per horse.

2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

Every athlete is supplied to deliver all necessary certificates of health for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

- a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Regulations 90/426 of the actual valid form (sample is enclosed to schedule) will be necessary.
- b) in case of arrival from a country not concerning to the EU, a certificate of health for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid form will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The athlete must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

3. VETERINARY ASPECTS "A"

VETERINARY REGULATIONS, 12th Edition, effective 5th April 2010

VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 23rd edition, effective 1st January 2009, updated 1st January 2010:

Art. 137.1

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (see GRs 139.2), and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 139.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 137.2

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VI

(except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

From 1 January 2005 onwards, influenza vaccination for all horses competing in FEI competitions requires a vaccination within six months + 21 days of the competition.

1. All horses intending to participate in FEI competition must have at least received an initial primary course of two vaccinations, given between 21 and 92 days apart. Thereafter, a third dose (referred to as the first booster) must be given within 7 months after the date of administration of the second primary dose, with at least annual boosters given subsequently (i.e. within one year of the last dose).
2. If the horse is scheduled to take part in an FEI competition, the last booster must have been given within 6 months + 21 days of arrival at the FEI event. (The 21-day window has been provided to enable vaccination requirements to fit in with the competition schedule).
3. No vaccination shall be given within 7 days of the day of arrival at the FEI event.
4. All horses that were certified as correctly vaccinated under the previous FEI equine influenza vaccination rule prior to 1st January 2005, do not need to start a primary course again provided that they have complied with the previous rule of primary course and annual re-vaccinations and the new rule of a booster vaccination within 6 months + 21 days of the day of arrival at the FEI event.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

(Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3*/4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate. At CCI3* and CCI4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Cup Finals, Championships and Games it is recommended that a minimum of 5% of all horses (with a minimum of 3 horses tested) must be sampled (see also VR Art. 1016.5.).

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (GROUP I & II ONLY)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge Athletes the equivalent of CHF 12.50 per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

MEDICATION CONTROL LABORATORY

X. MISCELLANEOUS

By handing in the entries, each owner or his delegate, by taking part in the event each athlete submits himself to the General and Special Regulations valid for the event and to the orders of the show direction.

1. PROTESTS

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of CHF 150.- or equivalent.

2. ENTRIES

Deadline (with details of the athlete and the horse) for all the comp. the next day is always the previous evening on 06.00 p.m.

3. PRIZE-GIVING CEREMONY

The OC reserves the right to carry out single prize-giving ceremonies at a later time.

The best 5 athletes have to present themselves for the prize-giving ceremony of each competition.

The owner of the winning horse is invited to the prize giving ceremony for the Grand Prix (comp. 6).

4. Distribution of Prizes and Indemnities

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 127/128 following the last competition at the latest. The scheduled prizes are gross amounts.

Settlement will be done per Athlete. Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each Athlete binds himself to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money. The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the Athlete. Acc. to § 50a EstG this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the turnover tax from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money, as a rule the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, 15 % exceeding 250 EUR (in force as of 01.01.2009); plus solidarity fee (at present 5.5 %) of the income tax amount.

Travelling expenses being taken over or reimbursed are only regarded as revenues if they exceed the actual costs and the reimbursement for additional meal allowances acc. to § 4 Abs. 5 Satz 1 Nr. 5 EstG. The tax deduction has to be certified on demand. Those foreign Athletes being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every Athlete himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

5. INSURANCES

All owners and Athletes are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses.

They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

6. LIABILITY

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, competitors, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. The OC is liable in case of intent, gross negligence as well as in case of injury to life, body or health and in further cases he is liable for compelling legal liability acc. to the legal requirements. Furthermore he also declines any liability for theft, damages, fire or other incidents.

7. EVENT'S ORGANISATION

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Delegate of the NF GER and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all Athletes and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Jumping Department by the Foreign Judge.

8. ENTRY RIGHT TO SHOWGROUNDS

Entry right to showgrounds will be handed out to athletes, one partner per athlete, one groom per athlete and per horse two owners (max. 2 horses per athlete acc. to FEI-passport) (this rule applies only to athletes of the CSI4* competitions), provided the names have been given to the show office before the event starts.

Entry Right to stable area acc. to VR Art. 1005.2.5.

9. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Athletes wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and Table C) must inform the OC before these competitions begin. These athletes will start first in these competitions.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
