Foreign competitors are invited by the Organising Committee through their NF.

German Competitors

- 2. Competitors who in agreement with the OC will be nominated by the federal trainer dressage.

Wildcards

- 1. The FEI has the right to nominate one competitor.
- 2. 2 competitors who receive a personal invitation of the OC through their home NF.

Formatiert

When handing in the entries competitors have to decide, if they are going to start a horse in comp. 24 (qualifier for comp. 26 – Grand Prix Special) or in comp. 25 (qualifier for comp. 27 – Grand Prix Freestyle).

The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting competitors („masterlist“), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.

VI. FACILITIES OFFERED

A. COMPETITORS and GROOMS CDI

- One groom per rider
- Special conditions for all competitors in the official event hotel, these conditions can only be granted if the reservation has been sent to EnGarde with the entries.
- Meals for grooms from Thursday, 15/01/2009 to Saturday, 17/01/2009: Breakfast and dinner in hall 3 near the stables; lunch at the casino in the administration building
- Meals competitor from Thursday, 15/01/2009 to Saturday, 17/01/2009: VIP area (hall 1)
- Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms with hot and cold water will be proved by the OC.

B. Stable Area/ Horses CDI

- 1 horse will be stabled free of charge in boxes 3 x 3 m from Thursday, 15/01/2009 to Saturday, 17/01/2009; first bedding included
- Forage, hay, straw and shavings can be purchased with the stable manager; Prices incl. VAT: straw 4,00 €, hay 7 €, shavings 14 €
- for additional horses a fee of 140 € per horse (incl. VAT) will be levied and 40 € waste disposal per box.

C. Transporters and Live-in-Caravans

- The license plate and the size of transporters/live-in-caravans have to be given with the entries.
- Electric supply for CDI competitors will be charged with 60 € incl. VAT. Electricity has to be ordered together with the entry.

D. Arrival / Departure

- The OC facilitates competitors and grooms on their arrival and on their departure. Therefore the OC needs date, time and means of transport of arrival and departure of competitors and horses.
- The stables will be available as of Thursday, 15th January 2009, 8.00 a.m. and have to be cleared by Monday, 19th January 2009, 08.00 a.m.

E. LOCAL TRANSPORTATION - ARRANGEMENTS FROM HOTEL TO SHOWGROUNDS

Shuttle service will be made available.

F. ADVERTISING AND PUBLICITY ON COMPETITORS AND HORSES

- The competitors are authorised to carry the logo of their personal sponsor in accordance with Art. 136.1, 2.
- The Chief Steward will check that the advertising and publicity on competitors and horses complies with Article 136 of the General Regulations. If the regulations are not fulfilled the competitor will get no permission for start.

- Entries without this information will not be accepted.
- The entries of foreign competitors have to be made through the HippoBase online entry system. Disciplines responsible of National Federations who do not yet have a user account are requested to send their full name, email and phone to support@hippobase.com.
- German competitors have to use the riders' entry cheques with the valid horse stickers.
- Closing dates of entries have to be adhered to. Later changes will only be accepted on approval of the OC.

- The number and kind of required stables, the number of required electric supplies and the required accommodation (kind, arrival and departure date) have to be given with the entries. If the entry does not contain information on number of boxes and/or electric supply, the OC reserves one electric supply per competitor and per horse entered one box. All expenses will be charged to the rider's account. Hotel rooms are only booked when ordered in writing.

For withdrawals after the date of definite entries or no-shows the competitor or the respective NF will be held liable to reimburse the OC for the actual financial loss incurred by the OC (i.e. stabling and hotel expenses) as a result of the late withdrawal or no-show.

VIII. CUSTOMS FORMALITIES/HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

1. Customs Formalities

According Vet. Reg. Art. 1004.2 the relevant National Veterinarian Authorities have to be informed four weeks in advance to assure a smooth frontier crossing of the horses from abroad.

For questions pertaining to the veterinary and animal diseases legislation for horses from abroad and regarding the horses' transportation, the following transport agency is ready to assist:

Custom and veterinary fees will not be taken over. A fee of 30 EUR per horse is charged for customs formalities

2. HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES

Every competitor is supplied to deliver all necessary certificates of health for the transport to the event or identification of the horses before they come into the stables:

a) in case of arrival from a EU-member-country, a certificate for registered horses acc. to sample of Annex B to Regalement's 90/426 of the actual valid form (sample is enclosed to schedule) will be necessary.

b) in case of arrival from a country not concerning to the EU, a certificate of health for registered horses acc. to sample of annex II of the decision of the commission 92/260 of the actual valid form will be necessary.

A certificate must be done in at least one official language of the country of destination and in one official language of the member country. The competitor must carry with him the original certificate, not a copy.

The organiser sees to it that on the competition site, an official state veterinarian is present to issue the health certificates which are necessary for the transport of the horses to their destination abroad.

In case the OC has entrusted to a forwarding agency, the latter is ready to assist regarding the required documents.

Furthermore, questions relating to health requirements for horses can be directed to the veterinary authorities in the country of origin or in Germany.

3. VETERINARY ASPECTS "A"

VETERINARY REGULATIONS, 11th Edition, 1st January 2009

a. VETERINARY EXAMINATIONS, HORSE INSPECTIONS & PASSPORT CONTROLS

These will be carried out in accordance with the "Veterinary Regulations", Art. 1011 & the discipline rules.

"General Regulations", 23rd edition, effective 1st January 2009:

Art. 139.1

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix D) in a foreign country (see GRs 141.2), and all horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, Championships, Regional and Olympic Games, whether at home or in foreign countries (see GRs 141.2), must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 139.2

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix D) in their country of residence are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

b. EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, VET. REGS. ANNEX VII (except events taking place in NZL & AUS)

All horses and ponies for which an FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, stating that it has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given between 1 and 3 months apart.

In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination. None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above are the minimum requirements for influenza vaccination. Both primary and first and subsequent booster injections should be given according to the manufacturer's instructions which will fall within the stipulation of the FEI ruling.

c. SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES

(Vet. Regs. Chapter V & VI and Annex IV)

Regular sampling is carried out in CCI3*/4*, CSIs (3*, 4*, 5*), CIOs, World Cup Qualifiers and Finals, Championships and Games, whereas at other CIs sampling is recommended. When testing takes place, the number of horses tested is at the discretion of the Testing Veterinarian/Veterinary Delegate; however, a minimum of three is recommended (Vet. Regs. Art. 1016)

Special guidelines are applicable for events covered by the FEI Medication Control Programme (Groups I & II only).

d. MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (MCP)

The Organising Committees of FEI events within Groups I & II are advised to charge competitors the equivalent of 8,50 € (~CHF 12.50) per horse per event as a contribution towards the costs of the MCP programme.

e. MEDICATION CONTROL LABORATORY

Under the Medical Control Programme (MCP) in Groups I and II, all samples collected in accordance with VR Art. 1017.1 will be analysed by Laboratoire Courses Hippiques, 15 rue de Paradis, 91370 Verrières le Buisson, France, Tel.: +33.1 - 69 75 28 28, Fax: +33.1 - 69 75 28 29.

X. MISCELLANEOUS

1. PROTESTS

All protests to be valid must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of 100,00 € (~CHF 150).

2. CEREMONY

Competitors are asked to be prepared to take part in a parade without horse during the opening and/or closing ceremony.

Provided it will not be announced otherwise, the riders placed 1st to 6th and all drivers have to attend the respective prize giving ceremony with their horses in accurate riding dress. Not attend the ceremony without valid excuse will entail disqualification.

3. GENERAL CLASSIFICATION AT THE END OF THE COMPETITIONS and PRIZE – CLASSIFICATION

Special rating acc. to announcements during the event and information in the rider's folder.

4. Distribution of Prizes and Indemnities

All prize money and all prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money as well as reimbursements (e. g. transport charges, travelling expenses) will be distributed acc. to FEI-RG Art. 130.2 following the last competition at the latest.

Per competition 25 % of the competitors receive prize-money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize-money, however at least 5 competitors will receive a prize.

The scheduled prizes are gross amounts. The total amount of prize money shown for each competition in the schedule must be distributed. If fewer competitors take part in a competition than the number of prizes indicated in the schedule, the President of the Ground Jury is responsible for recalculating the prize money to be distributed.

Depending on the agreement with the horse owner, each competitor binds himself, to pass on to the horse owners the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money.

The organizer is allowed to deduct possibly outstanding debts of the competitor. Acc. to § 50a Abs. 4 this also applies to foreign horse owners. After having deducted the turnover tax from the prize money or prizes in kind rewarded instead of prize money the following income tax will be due: no taxes up to 250 EUR, 10 % up to 500 EUR, 15 % up to 1,000 EUR, 20 % exceeding 1,000 EUR; plus 5,5 % solidarity fee of the income tax. The tax deduction has to be confirmed on demand. Those foreign competitors being exempted from tax deduction are kindly asked to submit an exemption certificate either with the entry or on the first show day at the latest. Every competitor himself is responsible for the correctness of the details he submits.

If at the final account a credit will be determined, the competitor will only receive a cheque from the competitor.

If a debit will be determined, the competitor has to pay the amount in EURO at the beginning of the show. Foreign currencies will be accepted at the conversion rate available in the show office. Competitors from countries in which the EURO constitutes the official means of payment, checks may be issued in EURO. All bank charges will be at the competitors' own account. Cheques in other currencies may not be accepted.

5. INSURANCES

All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

6. LIABILITY

The organizer declines any liability for property or pecuniary damage which may happen to visitors, competitors, grooms and horse owners through slight negligence of the organizer, his delegates or his assistants. He also declines any liability for theft, damages, fire or other incidents.

7. EVENT'S ORGANISATION

In exceptional circumstances, together with the approval of the Delegate of the NF GER (, the Chefs d'Equipe) and Ground Jury the OC reserves the right to modify the schedule in order to clarify any matter or matters arising from an omission or due to unforeseen circumstances. Any such changes must be notified to all competitors and officials as soon as possible and must be reported to the FEI Dressage Department by the Foreign Judge. In special circumstances (i. e. outbreak of FMD etc.) the OC reserves the right, to cancel or to break off the event in agreement with the FEI and the NF GER.

In the event of any discussion concerning the interpretation of the schedule (in translated languages), the English version will be decisive.

XI. THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
