The organiser draws up a list of all definitely starting competitors („masterlist“), classified according to the above criteria, which must be given to the German NF office, the Foreign Judge and the NF Delegate. Any alterations may only be done in mutual agreement before the event starts.

Competitors are invited by the Organising Committee through their NF. On the occasion of its statutory Meeting held in Berne, 28th May 1990, the Vaulting Committee agreed that, unless the provision of horses by the Organising is stipulated in the Draft Schedule, any vaulters arriving at an Event without horses shall be refused in the future.

6. FACILITIES OFFERED: (See GR and Art. 712, 713, 720)

1. Competitors CVI

Accommodation for the CVI competitors at the cost of the OC for 3 nights.

The reservation is sent with the entries to En Garde.

Meals: VIP area (hall 1) and grooms' catering.

2. Grooms CVI

One groom per rider.

Meals: Breakfast and dinner in hall 3 near the stables; lunch at the casino in the administration building.

Sufficient sanitary and showering facilities for male and female grooms with hot and cold water will be provided by the OC.

Accommodation for the groom and the longeur (double room) at the cost of the OC for 3 nights. The reservation is sent with the entries to En Garde.

OCs must provide sufficient sanitary and showering facilities, with hot and cold water for male and female grooms.

3. Stable Area

Size of boxes according to FEI rules (3 x 3 m).

Stabling (1 horse) will be free of charge; for **additional** horses a fee of 140 € per horse (incl. VAT) will be levied, first bedding included. EUR 40,- waste disposal per horse.

Forage, hay, straw and shavings can be purchased with the stable manager.

Prices incl. VAT: straw 4 €, hay 7 €, shavings 14 €.

6. Transporters and Live-in-Caravans

The license plate and the size of transporters/live-in-caravans has to be given with the entries.

Electric supply for CVI competitors will be charged with 60 € incl. VAT.

Electricity has to be ordered together with the entry.

7. Arrival / Departure

The OC facilitates competitors and grooms on their arrival and on their departure. Therefore the OC needs date, time and means of transport of arrival and departure of competitors and horses.

The stables will be available as of Thursday, 21st January 2010, 8.00 a. m. and have to be cleared by Monday, 25th January 2010, 08.00 a.m.

8. Shuttle Service

A Shuttle-Service from the show ground to the hotel will be arranged.

Entries without this information will not be accepted.
- The entries of foreign riders have to be made through the HippoBase online entry system. Discipline responsables of National Federations who do not yet have a user account are requested to send their full name, email and phone to support@hippobase.com.
- German competitors have to use the riders' entry cheques with the valid horse stickers.
- Closing dates of entries have to be adhered to. Later changes will only be accepted on approval of the OC.
- The number and kind of required stables, the number of required electric supplies and the required accommodation (kind, arrival and departure date) have to be given with the entries.
- If the entry does not contain information on hotel, number of boxes and/or electric supply, the OC reserves, one electric supply and per horse entered one box. All expenses will be charged to the rider's account. Hotel rooms are only booked when ordered.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**
